ART, INDEPENDENCE, AND THE RIGHT SUPPORT: LILI'S STORY

Lili Hernandez, a multimedia artist from El Salvador, has been creating art in California since 1998. She works with pencils, colored markers, acrylics, and digital tools like Procreate. She's also a photographer—often out in the community capturing images that inspire her—and enjoys experimenting with 3D printing.

Her introduction to Achievable Health came through Claudia Kunin, a renowned artist and longtime, generous supporter of the organization who curated the Lovelace Center's art collection. We're excited to have Lili's own work on display when the Lovelace Center opens in 2026. The entire collection features artists living with cerebral palsy—each piece a celebration of creativity, resilience, and voice.

Art has always been central to Lili's life, but living with cerebral palsy means she also relies on her wheelchair for mobility—whether she's in her studio or out photographing the world around her. When her old wheelchair began to fail, it became harder for her to move comfortably and safely. Despite more than a year of waiting, her previous health care provider wasn't able to get her through the complicated insurance process.

"As her mother, it was so hard to watch her struggle," said Ana. "We had been trying for over a year to get her a new chair, but the process just kept dragging on. It felt like no one was really helping her."

That changed when Lili came to Achievable Health. Our care coordination team worked with her specialists and insurance company to cut through the red tape. In less than three months, Lili received the customized wheelchair she needed—a process that had stalled elsewhere for over a year.

"The difference has been incredible," Ana shares. "She's comfortable again, she's supported, and she's able to go through her day without the pain and frustration of the old chair. For our family, it's been life-changing to see her cared for in this way."

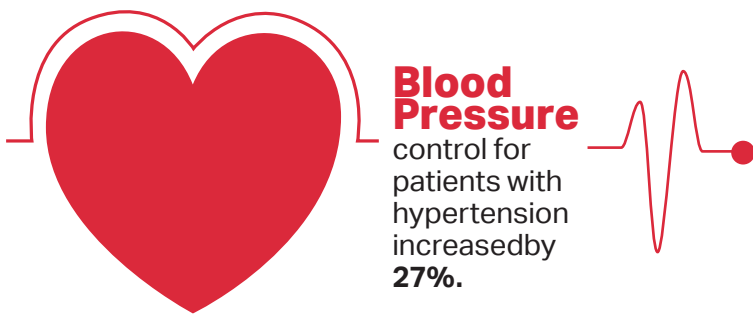

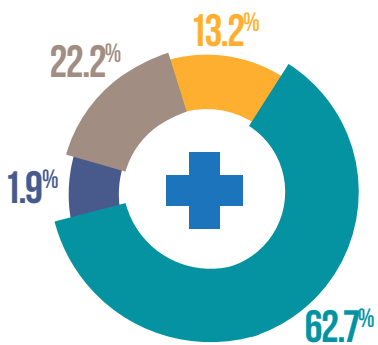

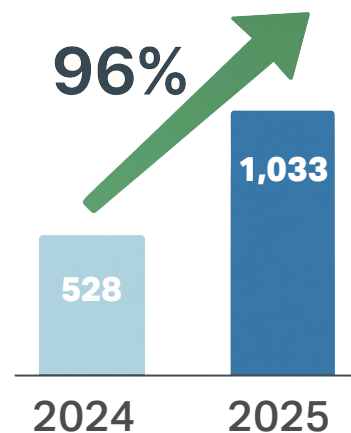
Type of Insurance

- % OF PATIENTS UNINSURED

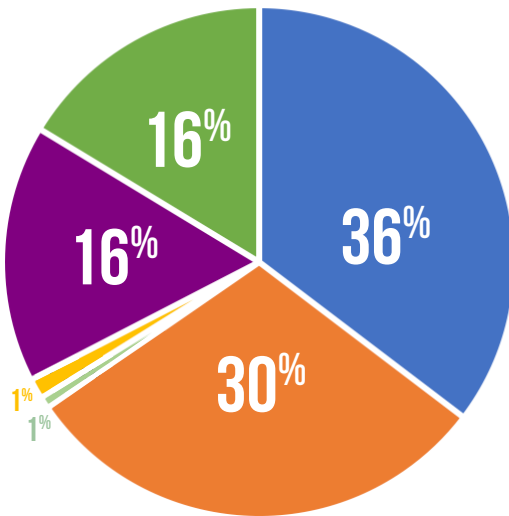
Increase in New Patients

We nearly doubled our number of new patients this year!



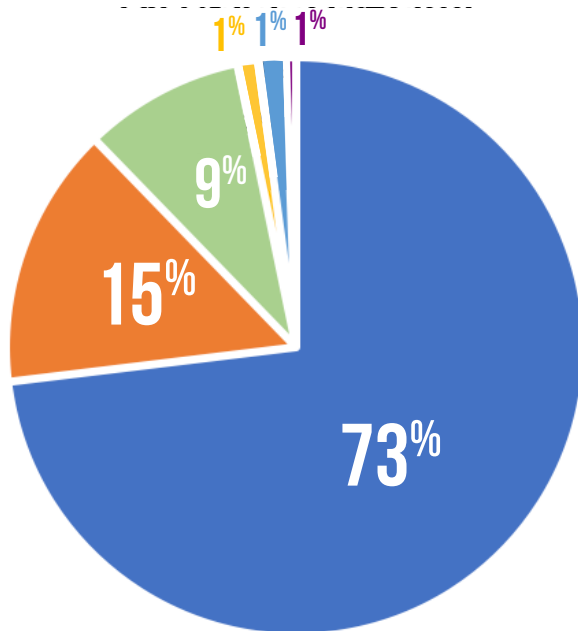

MOLLY ROSE — FINDING HER VOICE THROUGH ART

Molly Rose's world is full of color — bright, bold, and alive with imagination. A young adult on the autism spectrum, Molly communicates most clearly through her art, where every brushstroke reveals her humor, her joy, and her deep connection to others.

She discovered her love of painting at just 11 years old, under the guidance of Los Angeles artist and teacher Myra Horwitz. Since then, her art has carried her on a remarkable journey — from early lessons at home to gallery walls across California and beyond. At just 21, Molly celebrated her first solo show at the Artists Matter Gallery in Topanga, a milestone that reflected both her growing skill and her growing confidence.

Today, Molly's work has been shown from Santa Barbara to Santa Fe, from Portland to Los Angeles. Her paintings brighten cafés, wellness studios, and even wine labels. Collectors from around the world — Japan, Italy, New Zealand, and across the U.S. — have been drawn to her vivid, joyful style.

Molly's family first connected with Achievable Health when a family friend with an autistic son highly recommended they give it a try.

Behind the beauty of Molly's art is a larger story of support and perseverance. With the compassionate care team at Achievable Health, Molly has access to the healthcare that has helped her thrive as both an artist and a young person finding her place in the world.

The services at Achievable Health that have been most meaningful for Molly include the care she experiences from everyone — from the office staff, to the nurses, to her primary physician.

Her mom, Avra, describes Achievable Health as “a place that sees Molly — not just her diagnosis.”

As a parent, Avra reflects that Achievable Health's approach feels uniquely supportive and stands apart from other healthcare experiences because of the empathetic care and understanding of Molly's challenges that come with her diagnosis. Molly's art reminds us that communication comes in many forms — and that when individuals like Molly are supported to live fully, our entire community becomes more vibrant.
